Philippe Cambie began working with Chateau Bizard in 2009, and the 2009 Coteaux du Tricastin Grangette is a fruity, simple, straightforward wine that does not reveal the brilliance of Cambie. With a family history that dates back to 1712 and with their first estate wines bottled in 1862, this must be one of the oldest on-going estates in the southern Rhone Valley. Since these wines are from the Coteaux du Tricastin, a region not normally associated with high quality (but, rather, gorgeous black truffles), they do not appear on many consumers' radar screens. I do not know if these wines are imported in the United States, but at the estate, they sell between 7 and 10 euros per bottle, which makes them remarkable values. No known American importer.
